

Goals

Students will learn to:

- Demonstrate theory and skills necessary to first assisting
- Exhibit basic knowledge and skills necessary to begin clinical training
- Express knowledge of professional requirements to expand the scope of practice to include surgical first assisting
- Discuss and identify surgical anatomy, surgical techniques, common procedures and instrumentation relevant to cesarean birth
- Recognize common approaches and surgical techniques for cesarean birth
- Identify and/or demonstrate recommendations for appropriate aseptic techniques used during cesarean birth
- Identify common components of post-operative care
- Develop a plan for identifying complications
